# Aim of Community provisions

• to ensure that migrant workers and their family members do not lose their social security protection when moving within the Community

#### Coordination vs Harmonisation

Coordination means that Member States are free to determine

- who is insured
- which benefits shall be provided
- value of benefits
- conditions of eligibility

# The 4 basic principles

- Only one legislation applicable
- Equality of treatment
- Exportation of benefits
- Aggregation of insurance periods

#### Persons covered

- Employed and self-employed persons
- Pensioners
- Civil servants
- Students
- Family members, survivors and orphans
- Stateless persons and refugees

#### Matters covered

- Sickness and maternity benefits
- Invalidity benefits
- Old-age benefits
- Accidents at work and occupational diseases
- Death grants
- Unemployment benefits
- Family benefits

#### **New Developments**

 Extension of Regulation 1408/71 to third country nationals

Simplification & Modernisation

• European Health Insurance Card

### New Regulation 883/2004

• Entered into force on 20 May 2004

 Applicable only from the date of the entry into force of the new implementing Regulation

# New Regulation 883/2004 - Main Changes

- Extension of the personal scope
- Strenghtening of the equal treatment priniciple
- Cross border recognition of facts
- New chapter on pre-retirement benefits
- New rules regarding frontier workers
- Principle of good administration

#### Third country nationals

- extension of personal scope of Regulation 1408/71
- legal basis: Article 63 (4) EC
- opt-in: UK and Ireland
- opt-out: Danemark
