Three Key Pillars of EU External Aviation Policy

- Bring existing bilateral agreements between EU Member States and third countries into line with Community law
- The creation of a "common aviation area" with neighbouring countries
- Conclusion of ambitious global agreements with key partners (US, China, Russia...)





Bringing bilateral agreements in line with Community law



The European Court of Justice found on <u>5</u>
November 2002 that the bilateral air services agreements between EU Member States and the USA were **not in conformity with EC law**.

The nationality
clauses in all
agreements infringe
the right of
establishment (Art.
43 EC Treaty) as they
are discriminating on
grounds of nationality.

The agreements infringe the exclusive external competence of the EU.

In areas where EC legislation affects third countries, only the EU can enter into international commitments.



Regulation (EC) 847/2004



- Regulation on the negotiation and implementation of air service agreements between EC Member States and third countries
- Member States to notify bilateral negotiations to Commission
- Member States to negotiate 'Community standard clauses' with third countries
- Commission to decide if bilateral agreement between MSs and third countries may be concluded/ provisionally applied



Regulation (EC) 847/2004 cont.



- Community Standard Clauses:
 - Designation and revocation clauses;
 - Tariffs on intra EU routes;
 - References to nationals or carriers of a MS;
 - Ground handling.
- Horizontal negotiations with the Community: 23 third countries agreed and further negotiations ongoing



Agreements with third countries



Principles of agreements with third countries:

- Market access
- Regulatory convergence
- Level playing field for air carriers
- Technical co-operation



Agreements with third countries cont.



- Agreements in force:
 - Agreement on the European Economic Area (Iceland, Norway, Lichtenstein)
 - Agreement between the European Community and the Swiss Confederatio on Air Transport
- Agreements initialled/ signed:
 - European Common Aviation Area (South-East Europe)
 - Morocco
- Ongoing negotiations: US, Russia



Regulation (EC) 868/2004

- Regulation concerning protection against subsidisation and unfair pricing practices causing injury to Community air carriers
 - Aviation is a global industry and fair competition has to be ensured not only in the internal market but externally too
 - Rules on state aid and competition exist inside the EU and Regulation 868/2004 concerns subsidies and unfair pricing practices by third country airlines
 - This anti-dumping instrument may be used if third country airlines benefit from government subsidies or a non-commercial advantage, causing injury to EU airlines
