# LeaderSHIP 2015 Background and Timeline







- Based on Council Conclusions of 14 May 2001, calling on the EU shipbuilding industry to "continue improving its competitiveness"
- In line with the EU's longer term strategy for economic, social and environmental renewal as brought forward by the Lisbon Council of March 2000
- Sectoral transposition of the principles laid down in the Communication on "Industrial Policy in an Enlarged Europe" (COM(2002) 714 final of 11.12.2002)
- In line with the request by the European Council of 16-17 October 2003 to address the needs of specific industrial sectors, especially the manufacturing sector, regarding industrial competitiveness
- Close link with Communications "Fostering structural change: an industrial policy for an enlarged Europe" (COM(2004) 274 final of 20.04.2004) and "Implementing the Community Lisbon Programme: A Policy Framework to Strengthen EU Manufacturing towards a more integrated approach for Industrial Policy" (COM(2005) 474 final of 5.10.2005)

- Maintain and further develop a strong position in selected higher-value market segments
- Ensure world leadership in product and process innovation
- Develop a strong customer orientation
- Further improve the networked industry structure
- Optimise production processes and increasingly focus on knowledge-based products
