

The project is carried out to develop the organizational and institutional capacity of the Laughter Heals Association, which acts as a resource center for Turkish civil society actors devoted to improving the well-being of children with cancer. Within this framework, it is aimed to form structured committees with the support of existing volunteers, develop effective training/monitoring/audit programs, and strengthen communication.

- Preparing of Project Guidelines
- Mapping of Peer CSOs
- Preparing a toolbox for supporting peer CSOs.
- Organizing volunteer training

- Effectively functioning Volunteer Training and Parent Mentoring committees with each consisting of 10 people will be created.
- Organisational, professional, and administrative skills of at least 40 volunteers at Laughter Heals Association will be improved.
- Training will be provided to 50 families.
- Nation-wide awareness will be increased through the delivery of 18.000 brochures and 18 informative seminars in 18 Children's Oncology Services
- A new audit program for assessing the quality of staff activities and the functioning of Hygienic Play Centres (HPCs) will be organized.
- Public awareness about HPC (Hygienic Play Center), VTP & PMP (Parent Mentoring Programme) will be increased in cooperating with PEPA and distributing 100.000 informative brochures via 100 Pharmacies close to Pediatric Oncology Services in the targeted cities.
- A new communication plan to reach out nearly 10 million people in Turkey via social media will be put into practice.
- Capacity of HPC (Hygienic Play Center) Services will be increased to serve for approximately 150 kids with cancer (age 3-10) as a common target audience in istanbul.
- 150 kids with cancer and their families will be reached out.

The project is implemented with the aim of increasing UCIM's active democratic participation in political and decision-making processes and ensuring its financial sustainability and institutional strength. With the project, it is aimed to develop a sustainable donation/fundraising system based on social entrepreneurship; increase the advocacy and partnership capacity of the UCIM; raise awareness about the prevention of child abuse, children's rights, and active citizenship.

MAIN ACTIVITIES



- Organizing 10 "Volunteering Training Seminars" for 700 UCİM volunteers

- A trainer pond consisting of 60 trainers will be created to provide training on legal and psychological counseling, effective communication and mother and child.
- Trained 965 member/volunteer will use new education sets and moduls.
- Knowledge level of 600 students and 36 teachers will be increased.
- UCİM's visibility guide, membership plan, strategic plan and annual campaign strategy will be acknowledged.
- 60 CSOs will attend UCİM trainings.
- Partnership will be established with 20 new CSOs.
- 3 promotional videos and 1 documentary to be produced will be watched by more than 15.000.000 people.
- UCİM's lobbying skills will be strengthened.
- With the social media campaign, blogger mothers and famous names with a total of 600,000 followers will be informed about children's rights and social awareness will be created on children's rights by providing access to 25 million people.
- A donation of 50,000 TL will be collected through the "Istanbul Marathon Campaign".
- A sustainable fund resource will be provided by creating UCIM internet store, producing promotional materials and by developing donation methods.
- Support will be provided to 10 families in legal processes

In this context, strengthening the media and advocacy capacities of Turkish and Syrian CSOs and improving communication and cooperation between them to increase their participation in decision-making processes are aimed.

MAIN ACTIVITIES
