GUIDELINE FOR CALL FOR PROJECT PROPOSALS

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This is the first call for project proposals launched under the **"Regional Competitiveness Operational Programme – RCOP (2007-2009)**" co-financed by the European Union and by the Turkish Government under the **Instrument for Pre-Accession Assistance** (IPA). This call for project proposals aims to establish a pipeline of projects which will contribute to achieve the objectives pursued under the aforementioned Operational Programme.

As the Operating Structure (OS) responsible for the implementation of the programme, **the Ministry of Industry and Trade** (MoIT), is the key institution responsible for selecting and implementing the projects. Within this context, potential project proposals should be submitted to the Ministry.

Objectives of the call for project proposals

The Ministry has prepared a Multi Annual Work Plan (MAWP) in order to design a roadmap for all parties regarding the activities which will be carried out within the implementation process. According to MAWP, the Ministry has developed "**three packages**" approach in terms of supporting the projects.

Within this framework, the first package whose process is still going on will be composed of strategic umbrella projects which will be prepared and implemented by the national public bodies.

The second package will be made up of projects prepared by the local actors (**bottom up approach**) selected under this call for project proposals. This call for project proposals aims to establish a project pipeline of high-quality mature projects to be implemented fully by 31/12/2012 at the latest.

The first call for project proposals covers following five measures;

- **1.** Development of Industrial Infrastructure (Measure 1.1)
- **2.** Improvement of R&D, Innovation, Technology and ICT Environment and Infrastructure (Measure 1.3)
- 3. Improvement of Tourism Infrastructure, Promotion and Marketing Activities (Measure 1.4)
- 4. Providing Basic Information and Consultancy Support for Enterprises (Measure 2.1)
- **5.** Strengthening of Cooperation in Industry Corporate Sector (Measure 2.2)

Therefore, the project proposals should be developed and submitted by taking into account the above mentioned areas of activities.

Financial Allocation

The size of the projects must be such that minimum and maximum amounts of funds to be requested for financing from the programme should be between 2-10 million Euro under first priority, and 1-2 million Euro under the second priority. It has to be mentioned that the budgets of the projects can be higher than the above mentioned figures but the budget for financing from the programme has to be between those limits.

The overall indicative amount made available under this call for project proposals **is** \in **75 980 913** (\in 56 985 684 EU funding plus \in 18 995 229 Turkish Government funding). These figures are indicative and the Operating Structure reserves the right not to award all available funds in this call for project proposals



The rates of co-financing for each project in terms of the eligible public financing will be a maximum of 75% from EU funding and a minimum of 25% from National public resources.

The beneficiary of the projects will not be required to provide any financial contribution.

The breakdown of available IPA funding, by measures for this call for project proposals, is set out in the below table.

An applicant may submit more than one project. The Operating Structure reserves the right not to select more than one project submitted by the same applicant.

Formal approval of the financing of the selected projects will only take place after the finalization of the Conferral of Management process and signature of the Financial Agreement (FA) between the Commission and the Turkish side.

Timetable

This call for project proposals will remain open between **14 November 2008 and 16 January 2009**. **Any application submitted after the deadline (16 January 2009, 17:30 hrs) will automatically be rejected.** Applications received by postal after 16 January 2009, 17:30 hrs will be rejected also.

Application Process

Project applications must be submitted, in Turkish with an English translation, both in electronic version and in hard copy, using the OIS template. Applicants are recommended to attach the copies of relevant and supporting documents (such as pre/feasibility studies, technical specifications, results of market research, commitment letters from partners, etc.) to the OIS if available. The application form (OIS), guideline and other relevant documents are also available in the Programme website (**ipa.stb.gov.tr**) under the title of "Call for Project Proposals".

1. The Regional Competitiveness Operational Programme (2007-2009)

The aim of the Regional Competitiveness Operational Programme (RCOP) is to increase the competitiveness of Turkish economy to converge with the economy of the EU and to reduce regional socio-economic disparities. In order to achieve these goals, the RCOP concentrates the resources on a **limited number of** *regions, priorities and sectors,* where the Programme's impact and contribution will be highest.

1.1. The geographical and thematic concentration

In terms of geographical concentration, the Programme concentrates on regions having an income per capita below the 75% of Turkish national average and within these, on 15 "**Growth Centres**". Remarkable share of the programme resources will be allocated to these "Growth Centres" (Kahramanmaras, Samsun, Kastamonu, Malatya, Elazığ, Trabzon, Kayseri, Sivas, Gaziantep, Diyarbakır, Şanlıurfa, Erzurum, Batman, Van and Kars), which are considered to have high potential in terms of growth and serving to their surrounding according to Strategic Coherence Framework (SCF).



Map 1: Eligible 12 NUTS II Regions and 15 Growth Centers (White stars reflects the Growth Centers)

On the other hand, in terms of sectoral concentration, the Programme concentrates on SMEs, operating in manufacturing industry and tourism sectors, information society, research and development and innovation.

The Ministry has prepared a **Multi Annual Work Plan** (MAWP) in order to design a roadmap for all parties regarding the activities which will be carried out within the implementation process. According to MAWP, the Ministry has developed "**three packages**" approach in terms of supporting the projects.

Within this framework, the first package will be composed of strategic umbrella projects which will be prepared and implemented by the national public bodies. Besides, the following packages



(second and third) will be mostly composed of the projects which will be prepared by the local actors and collected after a call for project proposals to identify projects originating in the beneficiary regions in a competitive manner.

Formal approval of the financing of the selected projects will only take place after the finalization of the Conferral of Management process and signature of the Financial Agreement (FA) between the Commission and the Turkish side.

1.2. The Programme Priorities and Measures

The Programme is based on two priorities:

Priority 1: Improvement of Business Environment

The purpose of this priority will be to create a better business environment, to increase the number of new enterprises, enhance the productivity and the competitiveness of the existing enterprises and contribute to the overall rate of employment, by improving physical infrastructure and creating a supportive environment for SMEs in the target regions.

This priority focus on the development of industrial infrastructure, creation and development of financing instruments, improvement of research and development, innovation, technology and ICT environment and infrastructure, improvement of tourism infrastructure, promotion and marketing activities.

Priority 2: Strengthening of Enterprise capacity and foster entrepreneurship

This Priority aims to improve the efficiency and added value produced by enterprises, enhance their entrepreneurial capacity and increase the employment rate and overall competitiveness of the regions through the provision of basic information support and consultancy activities to SMEs, particularly start ups and strengthening the clustering and networking activities in the target regions.

Its measures focus on enhancement of research and development, innovation, ICT and entrepreneurial capacity of SMEs and strengthening of cooperation in industry corporate sector.

These priorities have been divided into six Measures.

The Measures under the first priority are as follows;

Measure 1.1. Development of Industrial Infrastructure

The aim of the measure is to create a more favorable investment environment for SMEs by upgrading the quality of existing business sites, bringing their supply more in line with demand and supporting the establishment of Common Facilities for SMEs in convenient locations.

Measure 1.2¹. Creation and development of financing instruments,

Measure 1.3. Improvement of R&D, Innovation, Technology and ICT Environment and Infrastructure

¹ This measure will not be the subject of this Call for Project Proposal



The purpose of this measure is to promote R&D, Innovation and usage of technology and transfer of knowledge to improve productivity and built a dynamic knowledge based economy.

Measure 1.4. Improvement of Tourism Infrastructure, Promotion and Marketing Activities.

This measure aims to develop competitiveness and employment and to decrease regional disparities through diversification of tourism activities, revitalizing and landscaping of tourism attraction areas for commercial use and support for promotion and marketing activities.

The Measures under the second priority are as follows;

Measure 2.1. Providing Basic Information and Consultancy Support for Enterprises

The aim of this measure is to strengthen the entrepreneurial culture and skills through consultancy and information support activities and to increase the investment capacity through facilitating access to finance for SMEs, particularly start-ups, on a set of themes.

Measure 2.2. Strengthening of Cooperation in Industry Corporate Sector

The aim of this measure is to strengthen horizontal and vertical cooperation in industry corporate sector through consultancy and information support activities for clustering, networking and cooperation activities.

2. Rules of this call for project proposal

Indicative list of eligible applicants and provinces per measure are given on pages 14 and 15 of the guideline.

Aim

This call for project proposal aims;

- ✓ To establish a measure-based project pipeline of projects to be implemented fully by 31/12/2012 at the latest ,
- ✓ To ensure a bottom-up project proposal development approach,
- ✓ To select high-quality and mature projects.

2.1. Eligible Measures

The Regional Competitiveness Operational Programme has six measures as mentioned in first part of the guideline. Due to the discussions between the European Union and the Turkish side, The Ministry of Industry and Trade decided to open call for project proposals for below mentioned measures;

- ✓ **Measure 1.1.** for Development of industrial infrastructure,
- ✓ Measure 1.3. for Improvement of R&D, innovation, technology and ICT environment and infrastructure
- ✓ Measure 1.4. for Improvement of tourism infrastructure, promotion and marketing activities.
- ✓ Measure 2.1. for Providing basic information and consultancy support for enterprises,
- ✓ Measure 2.2. for Strengthening of cooperation in industry corporate sector



The applicants should prepare their project proposals by taking into account the above mentioned measures.

2.2. Eligibility of applicants, who can apply?

Measure base eligible applicants within the framework of this call for project proposals are mentioned below and in the applicant –measure matrix. On the other hand applicants located outside the target regions may submit projects which are developed with close collaboration with the partners from the target regions if the projects will be implemented in the target regions.

Profit-making companies (or cooperation/joint ventures of profit making companies) and profit-making organizations are not eligible as an applicant and or partner under this call for project proposals.

Potential partners of the beneficiary should carry the same qualifications.

Measure 1.1.

Public institutions/agencies, business and enterprise development institutions/centers managing authorities of Organized Industrial Zones (OIZs) and Small Scale Industry Estates (SSIEs), national and regional chambers of industry and commerce, trade unions, unions, foundations and associations.

Measure 1.3.

Public institutions/agencies, managing authorities of Technology Development Centers (TDCs) and Technology Development Zones (TDZs), universities, scientific institutes and research centers, national, chambers of industry and commerce, trade unions, sector associations, foundations.

Measure 1.4.

Ministry of Tourism and Culture, public institutions/agencies, governorships, special administrations of provinces, municipalities, national and regional chambers of industry and commerce, sector associations, foundations.

Measure 2.1.

Public institutions, agencies, research centers, universities, non-profit organizations, national and regional chambers of industry and commerce, unions, trade unions, associations and foundations, etc.

Measure 2.2.

Public institutions, agencies, research centers, universities, non-profit making organizations, national and regional chambers of industry and commerce, unions, trade unions and associations, etc.

2.3. Eligible actions, actions for which an application may be made

The indicative eligible actions for each eligible measure are as follows.



Measure 1.1.

This measure will include the following indicative activities,

- ✓ Establishment, improvement and refurbishment of social, technical, production, storage and ICT facilities, and purchase of machinery, equipment, for common use of SMEs.
- ✓ Establishment, improvement and refurbishment of one stop shops, information and consultancy offices, etc.
- ✓ Establishment, improvement and refurbishment of business and enterprise development centers like ISGEMs,
- ✓ Establishment of logistic centers for common commercial use in convenient locations like inside or nearby industrial sites, nearby airports, harbors, main transport axis,

Measure 1.3.

This measure will include the following indicative activities:

- ✓ Establishment, improvement and modernization (including refurbishment and ICT infrastructure) of R&D, technology and innovation facilities like Technology Development Centers (TDC), Technology Development Zones, technology incubators without wall (DTI), incubation centers, technology transfer centers, excellence centers, etc.
- ✓ Supporting activities of public and non profit making institutions regarding commercialoriented R&D as well as collaboration on technology transfer, R&D and ICT usage through establishment (including infrastructure, refurbishment), development and operation of corporate networks and technology platforms among public sector, universities, R&D Centers and enterprises and connecting them to international networks.
- ✓ Establishment and modernization of social, technical and production facilities like labs, workshops, machinery, training/education facilities, etc. in Technology Development Zones and Technology Development Centers, Universities and in other possible locations.
- ✓ Establishment of one stop shops, information, consultancy, patent offices and other possible common service facilities in Technology Development Zones, Technology Development Centers, Universities, and other possible locations.
- ✓ Operations and investments outside the target regions provided that the activity is a networking or joint project supporting the competitive position of the target regions.

Measure 1.4.

This measure will include the following indicative activities,

- ✓ Improvement of tourism attraction areas through revitalization and landscaping and other relevant infrastructure investments.
- ✓ Establishment and refurbishment of tourism information facilities and centers.



- ✓ Support for promotion and marketing activities of public authorities and non-profit making organizations including the utilization of all possible information and communication tools.
- ✓ Support for the organization of local tourist events like festivals, exhibitions, fairs, etc.
- ✓ Support for the organization of national and international seminars, congress, etc. and participation in national and international fairs.

Measure 2.1.

This measure will include the following indicative activities:

- ✓ Supporting projects of public institutions and non-profit making organizations to supply basic information support for SMEs and particularly start-ups.
- ✓ Providing consultancy support for individual SMEs and particularly start-ups
- ✓ Facilitate direct investment support for SMEs and particularly start-ups through consultancy assistance for accessing financing schemes under measure 1.2

Measure 2.2.

This measure will include the following indicative activities;

- ✓ Supporting activities of public institutions and non-profit making organizations to supply basic information support and consultancy on clustering, networking and collaborative activities.
- ✓ Supporting activities of public institutions and non-profit making organizations on surveys and identification, need assessment, analysis and mapping of clusters and networks as well as developing cluster and networking roadmaps under the projects.
- ✓ Direct incentives for common actions and investments of potential or existing structures of business and industrial collaboration like clusters, networks and business representative organizations etc.

2.4. Indications on the co-financing of the selected projects

The overall indicative amount made available under this Call for Project Proposals is € 75 980 913 (€ 56 985 684 EU funding plus € 18 995 229 Turkish Government funding).

These figures are indicative and the Operating Structure reserves the right not to award all available funds in this Call for Project Proposals. The rates of co-financing for each operation in terms of the eligible public financing will be a maximum of 75% from EU funding and minimum 25% from National public resources. The breakdown of available IPA funding, by measures for this call for project proposal, is set out in the below table.

The beneficiaries of the projects will not be required to provide any financial contribution.

2.5. Budget and Time Limitations for operations/projects

The size of the projects must be such that minimum and maximum amounts of funds to be requested for financing from the programme should be between 2-10 million Euro under first priority, and 1-2 million Euro under the second priority. It has to be mentioned that the budgets of the projects can be higher than the above mentioned figures but the budget for financing from the programme has to be between those limits.

The Central Finance and Contracts Unit (CFCU) is responsible for carrying out tendering, contracting and payments, relating to contracts to be financed under the projects, on behalf of the beneficiary. Therefore, no funds shall be transferred to the beneficiaries. For further information please refer to the web site of the CFCU (http://www.cfcu.gov.tr/).

The implementation period of a project shall not exceed 36 months. All the activities have to be completed by 31/12/2012 at the latest. Applicants should be aware that implementation period also includes tendering and contracting period, which in many cases may take 9-10 months. If projects include large amount of works, supplies, large technical assistance procurement, this time limitations will be reconsidered by the OS.

The beneficiaries are responsible for preparing the necessary documents including; Terms of References (ToR) Technical Specifications (TS), Market Researches etc. under the supervision of MOIT.

2.6. Eligibility of costs

According to the Article 34 of the IPA Implementing Regulation the following expenditures are not eligible under the Regional Competitiveness Operational Programme. Ineligible costs included in the indicative budget of the OISs will be directly excluded by the Ministry.

- ✓ Taxes, including value added taxes;
- ✓ Customs and import duties, or any other charges,
- ✓ Purchase, rent or leasing of land and existing buildings,
- ✓ Fines, financial penalties and expenses of litigation,
- ✓ Operating costs,
- ✓ Second hand equipment,
- ✓ Bank charges, costs of guarantees and similar charges,
- ✓ Conversion costs, charges and exchanges losses associated with any of the component specific Euro accounts, as well as other purely financial expenses,
- ✓ Contributions in kind



The eligibility of the costs will be clarified according to the **"Operational Agreement**" that will be signed between beneficiary and MoIT.

The beneficiaries should be aware that, the projects to be financed cannot benefit from additional funds to be provided by national and Community resources.

2.7. Horizontal Issues

The projects shall guarantee the equality treatment (in gender, etc.) for benefiting from the results of the operation by taking necessary measures.

Having positive effect on clean production, energy efficiency and/or environmental aspects within a proposal/operation is an asset.

The involvement (in terms of active participation to the implementation and budget) of local actor and civil society for a proposal/operation is a considerable asset.

The proposals shall consider the involvement of newly established enterprises/entrepreneurs and disadvantaged people to the results of the proposal.

2.8. Other Issues

The project proposals should take into consideration the measure base identified outputs and result indicators clearly mentioned in the Operational Programme.

The Central Finance and Contracts Unit (CFCU) has the responsibility for carrying out tendering, contracting and payment on behalf of the beneficiary. **Therefore, the beneficiaries will not receive direct financial grants; instead, they will receive the works, supplies and services contracted by the CFCU** (http://www.cfcu.gov.tr/)

3. How to apply, and the procedures to be followed

Potential applicants should use the Operation Identification Sheet (OIS) while submitting project proposals to the Ministry. The OIS documents shall be submitted both in English and Turkish.

3.1. Application Form – Operation Application Sheet (OIS)

The applicants should fill all the parts of OIS document. In case of missing of **prioritized/mandatory parts (1- 3- 4.3- 4.4- 4.5- 5- 6- 8- 9- 12- 14)**, the project proposal will be directly rejected by the Ministry.

3.2. Where and how to submit the applications and questions?

Applicants should submit project proposals, to the Ministry of Industry and Trade, both in hard copy (printed document together with a signed submission letter) and by e-mail (electronic version) and also both in English and Turkish version.

Project proposals, submitted to other institutions by mistake, will be directly rejected.

Replies will be provided by e-mail in 1 week period up to 1st of January 2009 which is the deadline for request for clarifications. Queries through telephone, fax, etc. will not be replied.

3.4. Deadline for submission of the applications

The deadline for submission of the project proposals to the Ministry is 16th of January 2009, 17:30 p.m. The beneficiaries are responsible for submission of the applications on the mentioned deadline to the Ministry. The Ministry will not take into account the delays such as postal/cargo etc. on the submission.



4. Evaluation and selection of project proposals

4.1. Pre-selection Process

The MoIT will pre-select applications within fifteen working days following the deadline for application. The pre-selection will be carried out according to the below mentioned general selection criteria.

The project proposal should positively (yes) meet all the admission criteria.

The Operating Structure reserves the right to ask for clarification or complementary information or documentation at every stage of the pre-selection.

Following the pre-selection process, a "**Global List**" shall be established by the MoIT.

The Ministry shall announce the results of the pre-selection process (global list), on its website until the second week of February 2009. The applicants are recommended to follow closely the announcements on this web site.

4.2. Selection and Evaluation Process

The MoIT will submit above mentioned pre-selected project proposals (global list) to the Project Selection Sub-Committees for further evaluation.

Project Selection Sub-committees, appointed by the Sectoral Monitoring Committee, shall evaluate the pre-selected project proposals, in line with the strategic project selection criteria developed by the Ministry for each measure. Project Selection Sub-committees shall use the evaluation grids which are attached to this guideline.

Following the evaluation of the project selection sub-committees, project proposals will be classified on measure base under three groups;

1st Group; project proposals having score over 70 (Long List)

2nd Group; reserve list of project proposals having score between 69-50 (these projects need to be further developed and will be kept in project pipeline)

3rd Group; Rejected project proposals due to insufficiency in terms of meeting the requirements of the evaluation criteria and having a score below or equal to 49.



The long list of the projects will be ranked from the maximum score to the minimum score on measure base.

The Ministry reserves the right to modify the above mentioned thresholds.

The MoIT shall inform all the applicants, regarding the results of evaluation process by email in the second week of March 2009. A half page justification of the decision, based on the evaluation grids, will be attached to the e-mails. The Ministry has the right to reject the appeals taking into account the budget/balanced geographical dissemination limitations.

4.3. Re-Evaluation Process

The first group of project proposals (long list), having a score above **70** (1st group), will be re-evaluated by the Ministry and the European Commission in terms of:

- \checkmark Readiness and maturity of the proposal;
- ✓ Institutional/implementation capacity of the applicants;
- ✓ Geographically balanced distribution of the projects;
- ✓ Available budget resources.

The MoIT shall inform the applicants of the 1^{st} group after the re-evaluation process by official letter at the latest by the end of March 2009.

4.4 Assessment Process

The Ministry will re-assess the potential beneficiaries after the finalisation of re-evaluation process in line with below mentioned criteria;

- ✓ Administrative Capacity
- ✓ Budget Management Capacity
- ✓ Human Resources Capacity

The Ministry will send an official letter to the potentially awarded proposals (**Short List**) in order to sign an "Operational Agreement" with the Beneficiaries where the "detailed division of responsibilities and obligations between the MoIT and the Operation Beneficiary" will be laid down at the first level.

At second level before the launch of works, service or supply contracts the OS shall receive a set of document and perform control on Beneficiaries which will ensure that the Beneficiaries have enough administrative capacity, budget management capacity and human resources capacity (Works, Service and Supply Contract activities).

The MoIT shall provide guidance to the beneficiaries of the selected projects for the next stages of the process, including preparation of the project fiches and the relevant documents.

In addition to the above mentioned checks, the OS will also supervise all the implementation in line with the procedures detailed in the Implementation Manual for the Regional Competitiveness subcomponent. In that frame, the MoIT will appoint at least one expert as an Operation Coordinator who will conduct necessary supervision and controls on Operation Beneficiaries.

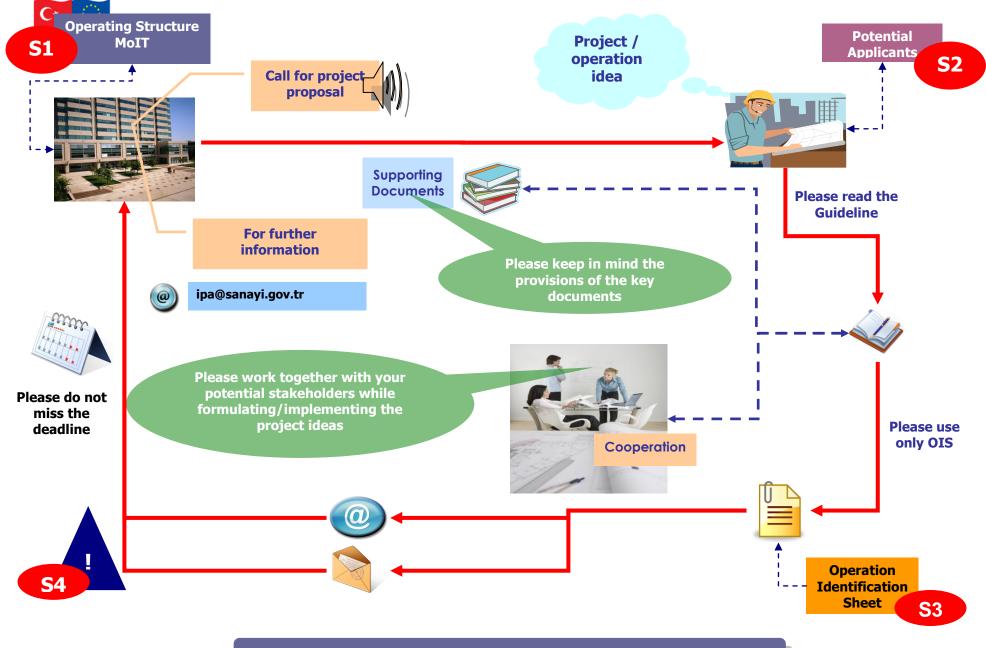

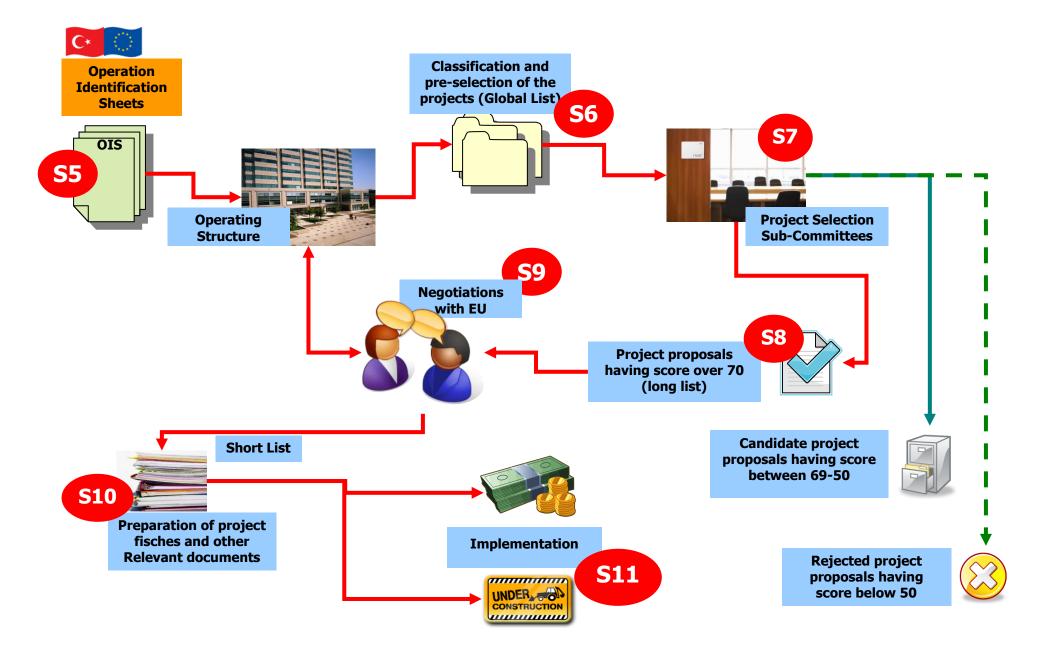
