Common market organization

Council Regulation(EC)1786/2003

- n Products covered by the CMO
- n ex 12141000:
 - n -flours and pellets of lucerne artificially heat-dried
 - n -flour and pellets of lucerne otherwise dried and ground
- n ex 12149090:-
 - n lucerne, sainfoin, clover, lupins, vetches and similar fodder produces,artificially heat-dried, except hay and fodder kale and products containing hay
- n lucerne, sainfoin, clover, lupins, vetches, honey lotus, chickling pea and birdsfood, otherwise dried and ground



n Ex 23099098:

n -protein concentrates obtained from lucerne juice and from grass juice

n -dehydrated products obtained exclusively from solid residue and juice resulting from the preparation of the concentrates referred to in the first indent

AMOUNT OF AID

- n Amount of aid per tonne: 33 Euro/t
- n aid is paid to the processing undertaking when the eligible product (raw protein non inferior of 15%, humidity rate non superior of 12% or 14%) leaves the undertaking warehouse

AID REDUCTION

- n Aid reduction(budgetary neutrality)
- n in case of excess of MGQ,the amount of aid is reduced:

ADVANCE PAYMENT

- n undertakings applying for aid are entitled to an advance payment of :
- n -19.80 Euro/t
- n corresponding to 60% of the normal aid amount

SUPPLEMENTARY ADVANCE PAYMENT

- n Supplementary advance payment
- n if undertakings lodge a security they can obtain a higher advance payment
- n dehydrated fodder:
 - n security: 6.6 Euro/t-advance payment
 - n 26.40 Euro/t
- n This corresponds to 80% of the normal aid amount

APPROVALS

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Each processing undertaking must be approved by the competent authorities of each Member State

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In case of infringement, approval may be withdrawn for a period commensurate with the seriousness of infringement

AID APPLICATION

- n processing undertaking must submit an aid application not later than 45 days after the month during which the goods have left it

HUMIDITY RATE

- n Processing undertakings must determine the humidity rate of the raw material by comparison with the weight of dried fodder obtained
- n This information is sent to the competent national authorities every quarter
- n national authorities shall inform the Commission twice a year

TRADE

- n no quantitative restrictions or similar measures
- n possibility of safeguard clause if serious market disturbances or risk of disturbances

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE FOR CEREALS

- n Members are:
- n -representatives of Member States
- n -representatives of the Commission(chairman)
- n competence: to give its opinion on draft regulations concerning dried fodder
