I. Objectives of Food Safety Policies

- Adoption of EU legislation
- Ensure safe food supply
- Assurance of protection of human health and consumers' concern in relation to food
- Integration of food-related services within one competent authority
- Implemention of food safety rules effectively and efficiently





II. RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES & COMPETENCIES





II. Responsible Authorities & Competencies

Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Affairs

- Primary production
- Approval and registration of establishments producing food of animal origin
- Production licence of foodstuffs and food contact materials
- Registration of retails and consumption places
- Official food controls through food chain
- Inspection, monitoring, surveillance, traceability of foodstuffs
- Export and import controls

Ministry of Health

> Natural spring and mineral water and foods for special medical purposes

Municipalities and Special Provincial Administration

Working licence and food register number for food establishments

▶ Chapter One (Objective, Scope and Definitions)

Definitions of;

- > Food
- ➤ Food Contact Materials
- Additives
- Primary Production
- Food production, food sales and consumption places
- > Food Businesses
- Safe Food and Food Safety
- Labelling
- Inspection and Control
- > Risk, Risk Analysis (Assessment, Management, Communication)
- > Traceability





➤ Chapter Two (Production Licence, Food Register, Registration, Employment, Laboratory Establishment Permit)

- > Food businesses (Article 4)
 - Comply minimum technical and hygienic requirements
 - Working licence and a food registration number
 - Production licence
- ➤ Laboratories (Article 5)
 - Public and private laboratory authorization by MARA
- > Employment (Article 6)
 - Responsible manager





➤ Chapter Three (Food Codex, National Food Codex Commission, Risk Analysis, Precautionary Measures, Scientific Committees and National Food Board)

- ➤ Turkish Food Codex (TFC) (Article 7)
 - Regulates foodstuffs and food contact materials
 - Contains minimum hygienic and quality criteria involving residues, additives, contaminants, labeling, packaging, transport, storage, sampling and analysis
 - Compliance with TFC requirements of all foodstuffs
- ➤ National Food Codex Commission (Article 8)
 - Establishment of National Food Codex Commission and sub-committees
 - Responsibilities and Tasks
- > Risk Analysis (Article 9)
 - Food legislation based on risk analysis
 - Independent risk assessment
 - Risk management





➤ Chapter Three (continues)

- > Precautionary Measures (Article 10)
 - Temporary risk management in case of identification of harmful effects on health
 - Scientific uncertainty persists
 - Provisional risk management measures may be adopted
- **➤ Scientific Committees** (Article 11)
 - Establishment
 - Supply scientific and technical data for risk assessment
- > National Food Council and Union of Food Banks (Article 12)
 - Establishment
 - Working procedures





➤ Chapter Four (Notifications, Emergencies, Crisis Management, Traceability and Business Responsibility)

- ➤ Notifications (Article 13)
 - > Establishment notification system
 - > Implementation
 - **≻** Communication
- ➤ Emergencies (Article 14)
 - >A possible hazard for health
 - > Measures taken
- Crisis Management (Article 15)
 - > A direct or indirect serious risk
 - > Establishment crises unit
 - ➤ Management and coordination





> Traceability (Article 16)

- >Food business responsibility
- ➤ Establishment of the system
- > Foodstuffs should be labelled or identified for traceability

▶Business Responsibility (*Article 17*)

- ➤ Not in compliance with food safety requirements
- ➤ Business responsibilities





> Chapter Five (Provisions Concerning Protection of Health)

▶Protection of Health (Article 18)

Food Businesses should;

- -Comply with the minimum technical, hygienic and safety requirements
- -Produce products in compliance with the food codex
- -Produce foodstuffs not posing any risk to human health





≻Chapter Six (Provisions Concerning Food Trade)

- ➤ Foreign Trade (Article 19)
 - Principles of inspection
 - Export and Import Controls
 - Compliance with National Food Codex, derogations and exceptions
- > Customs Centres (Article 20)
 - Identification of points of entry and exit
- ➤ Advertisement and Presentation (Article 21)
 - Provisions on labelling, advertisement and presentation
 - Functional foodstuffs, GMO's
- > Protection of Consumers' Rights (Article 22)
 - Information
 - Misleading consumers





➤ Chapter Seven (Market Surveillance, Inspection, Control, Certification and Objection Right)

- ➤ Market surveillance and inspection (Article 23)
 - Principles of inspection
 - Emergencies concerning public health
 - Food inspectors
- ➤ Control and certification (Article 24)
 - Delegation of tasks
- ➤ Objection Right (Article 25)
 - Food businesses rights





≻Chapter Eight (Special Provisions)

- > Provisions concerning water (Article 26)
 - MoH (appropriate packaging and selling of natural spring water and minarel water)
 - –MARA (processed water / mineral water)
- Food for special medical purposes and food supllements (Article 27)
 - MARA (food supplements and babybfoods)
 - MoH (enteral nutritional products, foods / bayby foods for special medical purposes)
- > Provisions concerning free zones (Article 28)
 - Procedures and principles





➤ Chapter Nine (Penal Provisions, Collection of Fines and Appeals, and Miscellaneous Provisions)

- **▶ Penal Provisions** (Article 29)
 - Banning from production
 - Fines
 - Imprisonment penalty
 - Withdrawal of products
 - Confiscation of products
 - Destruction of products
- > Collection of fines and objections (Article 30)
 - Fines given by the highest administrative authority
 - Right to object to criminal court
- ➤ Miscellaneous Provisions (Article 31)
 - Protection of public health (Ministry of Health)

- ➤ Food Law no 5179 is being revised for the full compliance with 178/2002/EC

 - Law on Veterinary Framework
 - Law on Feed
 - Law on Fisheries
 - Law on Plant Protection and Agricultural Quarantine
