# Regulation of EP and Council (EC) No 1760/2000

Establishing a system for the identification and registration of bovine animals

- Approved eartag
  - born or imp. from 3rd country except for slaughter within 20 days
  - each ear same individual identification code period < 20 days after birth</li>
  - eartags retained from other MS
  - removal/replacement permission from comp.auth.
- Computerised database fully operational 31/12/1999
- Cattle passport
  - < 14 days of notification of birth/re-identification (imp.)</p>
  - all movements national movements Comm. recognition
  - return to comp.auth. the last keeper 7 days
- Holding register each keeper except transporter
  - Up-to-date births, deaths, movements to and from the holding notification to comp.auth. - period 3-7 days
- Competent authority MS shall designate

# Commission Regulation (EC) No. 911/2004

### Eartags, passports and holding registers

- Eartags country code, 12 digits max.
- Passport ID, date of birth, sex,
   breed/colour, ID of dam, ID of holding of birth, ID of successive holdings and date of change
- Holding register up-to-date ID, date of birth, sex, breed/colour, date of death on the holding, all movements (ID of previous/next holding, date), inspector's signature

# Commission Regulation (EC) No.1082/2003

#### Minimum level of controls

- 10 % of holdings
  - eartags, holding register, passports
- selection based on risk analysis
  - number of animals/public and animal health considerations/amount of annual premium/significant changes and results of previous checks
- annual report to the Commission 31 August

# Commission Regulation (EC) No. 494/98

### Application of min. adm. sanctions

- one or more animals non-compliance:
  - restriction on movement of all animals on the holding
  - identification not proven destruction
- animals partial compliance:
  - restriction on movement of animals concerned
  - more than 20% => restriction on all animals
- non-payment of charges
  - passport, restrictions (may)
- non-reporting of movements, births and deaths
  - restriction on movements to and from (shall)

# Computer database for bovine animals Council Directive 64/432/EEC as revised in 1997

Fully operational by 31 December 1999 Information on:

#### For <u>each animal</u>:

ID (country code and identification number max. 12 figures), date of birth, sex, breed/colour, ID of dam or ID given ~ ID of origin in 3rd country, ID of holding of birth, ID of holdings passed and dates, date of death or slaughter

#### For <u>each holding</u>:

ID (country code and identification number max. 12 figures), name and address of holder

# Extension of the maximum period for applying eartags

Commission Regulation (EC) No 509/1999 – bisons Commission Decision 2004/764/EC – NL nature reserves

Commission Decision 2006/28/EC - certain bovine animals

- MS may extend
- Not effect the quality of information in the national database
- age/separation from mother/leaving the holding.

## Council Directive 92/102/EEC (I)

Identification and registration of animals – since 9 July 2005 only relevant to porcine animals

- Up-to-date list of all holdings
  - Species
  - Keepers
  - identification mark
- Keeper's register on the holding
  - up-to-date record of movements number of animals, origin/destination, date

## Council Directive 92/102/EEC (II)

### identification marks

- as soon as possible before leaving the holding of birth
- eartag or tattoo holding of origin
- removal or replacement of marks permission of the competent authority
- new marks registered by keeper link
- national systems for movements holding of origin and of birth
- animals imported from 3rd countries 30 days

# Computer database for pigs

Council Directive 64/432/EEC as revised in 1997

Fully operational by 31 December 2002 Information on:

For each holding:

ID, name and address of holder

For <u>each movement</u> of groups of pigs:

Number of animals being moved

ID of holding of departure/Date of departure

ID of holding of arrival/Date of arrival

#### Commission Decision 2000/678/EC

# Detailed rules for computer database for pigs

- Information on each holding
- mandatory
  - ID (country code and identification number max. 12 figures), address of the holding, name and address of the person responsible for the animals, the geographic co-ordinates or equivalent, data field for sanitary information

#### Optional

 type of production, name and address of the owner, name and address of the person responsible for sanitary measures, other information deemed necessary by the competent authority

#### Commission Decision 2006/80/EC

(repealing Commission Decisions 95/80/EC (PT) and 2005/458/EC(IT))

# Granting certain MS the derogation provided for in Art. 3(2) of Council Directive 92/102/EEC

- Comp.auth. may exclude from the central list holdings with one single pig, which is intended for their own use or consumption
- The animal shall be subject to controls before any movement
- CZ, FR, IT, PL, PT and SK

# Council Regulation (EC) No 21/2004 (I)

#### Identification and registration of sheep/goats

- All animals born after 9 July 2005:
  - unique individual identification country code and individual code (max. 13 digits) at the latest by 6 months of age (possible derogation to 9 months)
- Means of identification: one eartag +
  - one eartag, or
  - an electronic identifier technical characteristica, or
  - for national movements only:
    - » a tattoo,
    - » mark on the pastern (goats), or
    - » national systems (IE and UK).
- Animals intended for slaughter before the age of 12 months (in the Member State concerned)
  - Competent authority may authorise one eartag with country code and ID code of holding of birth.

## Council Regulation (EC) No 21/2004 (II)

- Holding register:
- From 9 July 2005:
  - Information on the holding (ID code, address and geographical indication, type of production and latest inventory, name and address of keeper)
  - Movements
    - » From: ID code or address of holding of destination, data on transport and the date of departure
    - » To: ID code of the holding of dispatch and the date of arrival
  - Replacement of tags or electronic devices
- From "1 January 2008":
  - information on the individual animals ID code, year of birth and date of ID, month and year of death on the holding, breed and genotype if known.
- Name and signature of inspector

# Council Regulation (EC) No 21/2004 (III)

#### Movement document:

- From 9 July 2005:
  - ID code of holding of origin, name and address of keeper, and the number of animals moved, ID code of holding of destination and data on transport.
- From "1 January 2008":
  - information on the individual animals ID code.

#### Computerised database:

- data on holdings (ID, occupation of keeper, species, latest inventory),
- an entry in the database for each movement number of animals moved, ID code of holding of departure and arrival, date of departure and arrival - optional until 1 January 2008.

## Recognition of national systems

Commission Decision 2005/597/EC – IE

Commission Decision 2005/617/EC – NI and GB (UK) temporarily

- National system replacing the second means of identification
- Animals intended neither for intra-Community trade nor for export
- Comp. auth. shall carry out the appropriate on-the-spot checks each year to verify compliance by the keepers

# Identification of equidae

Council Directives 90/426/EEC and 90/427/EEC

- Since 1 July 2000 all equidae must be accompanied by an identification document throughout any movement.
- Registered horses passport
  - (Commission Decision 93/623/EEC)
- Equidae for breeding and production identification document
  - (Commission Decision 2000/68/EEC)
