

Overview (CONT'D)


- > 95% of passenger transport and 90% of freight transport performed by road (Domestic).
- > 5 million people employed in road transport sector.
- ➤ 12 billion € added value to economy.

- ➤ International freight transport:
 - √1.406 licensed operators
 - √2,486 trailers
 - √37,571 semi-trailers
 - √32.930 tractors
 - √17,431 lorries
- ➤ International passenger transport:
 - ✓172 licensed bus operators providing service by 1,930 buses.

Responsibilities of the Ministry of Transport

- > Regulating access to the market and profession
- Regulating and issuing operator licenses
- Inspecting and monitoring market conditions





Other Responsible Authorities in Road Transport

- Ministry of Public Works and Settlements
 - Regulating and collecting tolls,
 - Traffic Statistics: collecting traffic data on toll roads
- Ministry of Interior (Directorate General of Security)
 - Road side vehicle inspection and its regulation
- Ministry of Industry and Trade
 - Regulating technical standards; tachograph, speed limiters etc.
- Ministry of Labour and Social Security
 - Regulation of social conditions
 (enforcement of driving times, rest periods, working time)

 - Framework law for access to the market and profession
- By-Law on Road Transport (Official Gazette: 25 February 2004, no 25384)
 - Secondary legislation for access to the market and profession
- By-Law on Training for Professional Competence in Road Transport Operations (Official Gazette: 03 September 2004, no 25572)





- Foreign Direct Investment Law No. 4875 (Official Gazette: 17 June 2003, no 25141)
- Turkish Commercial Code No. 6762(Official Gazette: 25 July 1956, no 9353)





Legislation (CONT'D)

These regulations introduce;

- > conditions for admission to occupation and market access,
- licensing system/mechanism for transport operations,
- > licensing system for certain auxiliary transport categories,
- rights, responsibilities and obligations for the carriers, transport undertakings as well as consumers users,
- conditions for vehicles to be used,





- > rules regarding competition in the sector,
- > rules for control and inspection,
- rights, responsibilities and obligations of the personnel who work in transport sector,
- rules and procedures for training and obtaining the Professional Competence Certificate





- > With the introduction of licensing system;
 - In Domestic Freight Transport: 247.772 licenses issued (August 2006) (Roughly 90% of commercial road vehicles registered)
 - In International Freight Transport: 1.406 licenses issued (August 2006) (Almost 100% of commercial road vehicles registered)
- ➤ For the first time, license system is introduced in domestic freight transport market.





Legislation (CONT'D)

Through these regulations;

New vision with EU Acquis - High quality in the sector

- ➤ Who can apply for license?
 - natural persons,
 - legal persons established according to Turkish legislation in force and registered under Turkish commercial registry,





- What are the general conditions?
 - not to be convicted of any freedom-limiting penalty and not to have a bad repute in commercial area,
 - registry at the relevant chambers of trade and industry, or chambers of tradesmen and craftsmen,
 - minimum one medium or higher level manager having Professional Competence Certificate or employ the person or people having such certificate (except for transport for own account),
 - having the sufficient financial resources for the establishment, good management and operation of transport related activities





- ➤ Any natural and legal person established according to Turkish Commercial Code can;
 - operate and offer road transport related service after obtaining relevant/ appropriate licenses from MoT.
 - establish relevant agents and branches throughout the country
- Natural and legal person that are not Turkish nationals can also obtain a licence if they comply with the provisions of "Direct Foreign Investment Law" and conditions specified by Road Transport Law/By-Law.



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- "Foreign-registered vehicles may not perform transport between two points within the borders of Turkey" (Article 42 subpragraph d)
- Foreign vehicles transporting to/from/through Turkish territory require permit, unless exempted by bilateral agreements.
- "goods coming to Turkey by seaway, railway or airway and carried to third countries from the point of arrival, can only be transported by Turkish hauliers. For foreign—registered motor vehicles a special permission is required from MoT. (Article 12-13 of Law on Road Transport).





Legislation (CONT'D)

3 main criteria for market access; (Articles 12 -13, By-Law on Road Transport)

- good repute
- professional competence
- financial standing





Legislation (CONT'D)

GOOD REPUTE;

- > not to be convicted of;
- crimes such as smuggling, fraud, false bankruptcy, falsification
- misuse of belief, narcotics and gun smuggling, human trafficking or trade, theft, corruption.
 - not to violate the rules on;
- weights and dimensions,
- driving and resting time,
- working and wage conditions etc.



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Legislation (CONT'D)

FINANCIAL STANDING: having the sufficient financial resources for the establishment, good management and operation of an undertaking.

Financial standing arranged in terms of the types of licenses.





Legislation (CONT'D)

For International Freight Transport License;

- vehicle fleet consisting of minimum 10 units corresponding to a total of 300 tonnes loading capacity
- ➤ capital of 50.000 €

For International Regular Passenger Transport License;

- > total of 150 seats capacity in minimum
- capital of 50.000 €
- regular bus line agreement/contract concluded with a foreign partner company.





Legislation (CONT'D)

In Passenger Transport;

- ➤ Authorisation for occasional services and shuttle services are also required for access to market.
- Special regular bus services are currently exempted from authorisations, and their regulation was delegated to local and provincial authorities.
- Passenger transport up to 100 km is also currently delegated to local and provincial authorities, within the framework of Law on Road Transport.





- ➤ Licenses valid for 5 years (Article 6)
- ➤ Licenses not be transferable in any conditions (Article 31)
- Suspension of licences with a reasoned decision in case of loss of good repute and/or financial standing (Article 82)
- Conditions for withdrawal of licenses, right of appeal against withdrawal, and implementation of jurisdiction results are clearly defined (Article 82)



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- ➤ International transport exempted from the authorisation or permits (Article 7)
 - · Fire brigade services,
 - Ambulance transport,
 - Funeral transport,
 - Transport of medicine, instruments and medical equipment in cases of emergencies, especially natural disasters,
 - Postal transport performed within the frame of public services.
 - Transport in cases of failure, accident or similar conditions.





- ➤ In the event of a crisis in the market in the carriage of goods by road, MoT may;
 - bring restrictions, limitations (including plate limitations)
 - make new arrangements (in issuing and/or number of licenses, capacity and/or number of vehicles, transport routes/lines)
 - "in case of an unnecessary increase in the number of transport operators and in the capacity of passenger-goods transport or to prevent unfair competition, waste capacity and waste of resources or for public good and safety reasons." (Article 8)



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Legislation (CONT'D)

By-Law on Training for Professional Competence in Road Transport Operations lays down the rules and procedures for;

- > training and examination of professional competence,
- > qualifications of the institutions in charge of the training,
- > authorisations to be issued to the training institutions,
- Certificate for Professional Competence to be delivered to the trainees and those exempted from exam.





Administrative Capacity

- New staff recruited.
- ➤ A new Department for Professional Competence within DGLT was established.
- ➤ A new Department for Transport of Dangerous Goods was established.





Administrative Capacity (CONT'D)

- > A computer-aided automation system to mitigate workload
 - Common interest for all stakeholders in road transport
 - Links with regional transport directorates of DGLT
 - All road transport activities to be carried out in electronic form
 - A real time and reliable statistical data
 - An effective and fair control system



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Administrative Capacity (CONT'D)

Assistance to the Turkish Road Transport Sector Project

EU funded Project, 3 Components (Twinning, Service, Supply)

- Twinning: to establish and develop the legislative and institutional framework of the Turkish road transport sector in accordance with the EU acquis.
 - Partnership with the Netherlands and Germany
 - Duration of 18 months.
 - Officially started on May 2006.





Administrative Capacity (CONT'D)

- Service: to assess the training needs of the ministries and public administrations involved in the implementation of the road transport legislation; prepare and implement a training programme to enhance human resources management capabilities.
 - Duration of 10-15 months.
 - Final Report on Assessment of Training Needs and of Quality of the Road Transport Training Facilities prepared and approved by CFCU.
 - Tender proposals under evaluation.





Administrative Capacity (CONT'D)

- 3. Supply: purchasing of 1500 mobile data terminals and 10 mobile control offices for roadside checks.
 - ToR sent to CFCU for evaluation.
