

Council regulation (EEC) n° 684/92 of 16 March 1992 on common rules for the international carriage of passengers by coach and bus (as modified by Regulation 11/98)

(OJ L 74 of 20.03.1992)



Based on Article 71 (1) a) of the Treaty



Aim

- To establish the definitions of the various international coach and bus services, classified as regular services, special regular services and occasional services
- To introduce a system of market access exempt from authorization for all occasional services, special regular services and all own account transport.
- To maintain the system of authorization for the regular services.
- To introduce the community licence, drawn up in accordance with a harmonised model, in order to facilitate the inspection of transport operations.



Commission regulation n° 2121/98 laying down detailed rules for the application of Council Reg. N° 684/92 as regards documents for the international carriage of passengers



Based on Council Regulation (EEC) n° 684/9 of 16 march 1992 on common rules for the international carriage of passengers by coach and bus



Aim

■ To implement the documents required for the different types of services as defined by Regulation n° 684/92.



Council regulation (EEC) n° 12/98 of 11.12.97 laying down the conditions under which non resident carriers may operate national road passenger transport services within a Member State

(OJL4 of 08.01.1998)



Based on Article 71 (1) b) of the Treaty



Aim

- To remove all restrictions against carriers providing the services in question in the grounds of their nationality or the fact that they are established in a Member State other than that in which the service is to be provided.
- To harmonise the definitions of the various coach and bus services with those adopted in the context of international transport of passengers.



- The Regulation allows the operations of cabotage for
- the occasional services, as well as for the special regular services provided that they are covered by a contract concluded between the organiser and the carrier, the regular services, provided they are performed by a carrier not resident in the host Member State in the course of a regular international service in accordance with Regulation (EEC) n° 684/92.
- Cabotage transport cannot be performed independently of such international service. In that case, the transport services performed shall be subject to the existing laws, regulations and administrative provisions in force in the host Member State regarding authorisations, tendering procedures, routes to be operated and regularity, continuity and frequency of services as well as itineraries.
