

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


Road Transport Policy in the EU

- White Paper on transport policy (2001)
- Fight Congestion
- Increase Road Safety
 - 50% reduction of road fatalities by 2010
 - A shared responsibility
 - An integrated approach

Road Safety Mid term review

- Where are we with the target?
 - Actual figures : 50.000 fatalities in 2001, 40.900 fatalities in 2005
 - A global 17.5% over 4 years when 27% would have been needed to meet the 2010 target
- Not so bad, but ...
- The mid term review on road safety announced in the road safety action programme, has been adopted and published on 22 February 2006 by the Commission

Training

- Directive 2003/59/EC on training of professional drivers:
 - Legislative and administrative adaptations necessary to comply with the Directive : before 10.09.2006

Licensing

- Driving licence Directive
 - Political agreement in Council of 27/03/2006
 - Application in 2012



Provisions of driving licence Directive (categories C and D)

- Introduction of a limited administrative validity :
 - Categories A and B : every 10 years (up to 15 years possible)
 - Categories C and D: every 5 years
- Harmonisation of the periodicity of the medical checks for professional drivers: every 5 years
- Staged access to categories C and D



Professional drivers training: the situation today

- Obligatory initial qualification only in certain MS
- Obligatory periodic training : same situation
- In the other MS, drivers have no other qualification than a driving licence
- A review in some MS revealed that 30% of drivers was never offered any training at all
- Driver licensing is at a low level in some MS



- Initial qualification: two models
 - Combination of course attendance and a test
 - Test only
- Initial qualification: two options for MS
 - Vocational training between 6 months and 3 years
 - Accelerated qualification depending on age and type of vehicle



- Periodic training:
 - 35 hours every 5 years
 - Minimum periods of training of 7 hours
 - Maximum of flexibility
- Contents of initial qualification and periodic training:
 - Annex I
 - Update possible through comitology



Content focuses on:

- road safety
- technical characteristics of vehicle
- fuel consumption
- loading
- accidents at work; physical risk
- criminality and trafficking
- emergency situations
- image of the company; economic environment



- Transposition into national law: 10.09.2006
- Two more years until application in the field
- All new bus drivers will have to be trained as from 10.09.2008
- All new truck drivers will have to be trained as from 10.09.2009
- All (4 to 5 million) working drivers will have to attend their first periodic training before 10.09.2014



Training should lead to:

- better knowledge, better skills, better service, better quality
- more self-confidence and job satisfaction
- a revaluation of the profession: more attractive for youngsters to enter the profession and for existing drivers not to leave the profession (retention)
- improved road safety
- reduced fuel consumption and exhaust emissions
- reduced costs
