**Conventional Sources of Energy - Gas** 

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#### Article 1

 Covers transmission, distribution, supply and storage of natural gas + operation of market

#### **Article 2 Definitions**

Article 3 Public Service Obligations - no universal service, social and economic cohesion, environment and climate change



Art. 4 Authorisation of new facilities – preinvestment equal treatment
Art. 5 Monitoring of security of supply
Art. 6 Technical Rules (EASEE Gas, Eurogas standards etc.)



Transmission, Storage and Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) Art. 7 Designation of system operators Art. 8 Tasks of system operators (incl. balancing) Art. 9 Unbundling – in legal form, not assets Art. 10 Confidentiality

# Directive 2004/67 Security of Gas Supply

Art. 1 Objective – transparent security of supply (SoS) policies Art. 2 Definitions Art. 3 Policies – 'roles and responsibilities' & definition of roles Art. 4 SoS for Households (winter criterion '1 in 20', partial supply disruption etc)



# Directive 2004/67 Security of Gas Supply

Art. 5 Reporting Art. 6 Monitoring (by the Commission) Art. 7 Gas Co-ordination Group Art. 8 National Emergency Measures Art. 9 Community Mechanism – 'guidance to MS'

Art. 10/11/12 Monitoring / Transposition / Entry into Force



Art. 1 – Scope – 'non-discriminatory rules for access conditions to natural gas transmission systems' / harmonised tariffs &/or methodologies
Art. 2 Definitions – all transmission, <u>no transit regime</u>

Art. 3 Tariffs – cost based + regulatory return on investment



Art. 4 – TPA Services = common network code and non-individualised services / firm capacity (that is, absolutely sure capacity) and interruptible (for a variety of reasons) / long and short term services

Art. 5 – Capacity allocation / UIOLI principle + capacity rationing on rational basis



Art. 6 Transparency Art. 7 Balancing Rules and imbalance charges Art. 8 Trading of capacity rights – b standardised contracts Art. 9 Guidelines – detailed harmonised rules to facilitate cross-border trade



Art. 10 Regulatory Authorities Art. 11 Provision of Information Art. 12 Right of Member States (enhanced cooperation) Art. 13 Penalties Art. 14 Committee Procedure Art. 15 Commission Report Art. 16 Derogations (analogue to Art. 22 Gas **Directive**) Art. 17 Entry into force
