"Stocks Directive" and other Emergency legislation

"Stocks Directive" = Directive 68/414 as modified by Directive 98/93





Key parts of the acquis

- Council Directives 68/414/EEC and 98/93/EC (stocks)
- Council Decision 68/416/EEC (bilateral agreements)
- Council Directive 73/238/EEC (on measures for mitigating effects of oil supply difficulties ..)
- Council Decision 77/706/EEC (fixing a target for a reduction in the event of supply difficulties ..)
- Commission Decision 79/639/EEC





Some key stockholding obligations:

- 90 days of stocks in 3 product categories unless special arrangements (new MS)
- MS must report regularly on stocks and inform on bilateral agreements
- A consultation between MS must take place before drawings due to reduce stocks under the compulsory level
- MS must inform the Commission of any withdrawals

Some key points on stocks:

- Stocks levels to be met as required under Directives and Act of Accession.
- Obligation is consumption based and applies for 3 categories of main oil products: gasoline, middle distillates and fuel oils (art. 2).
- Minimum requirement depends on domestic production (max.25% allowance)
- "Ownership" criterion (art. 3.1 and 6.2)





<u>Set-up of stockholding systems:</u> Fairness - Stockholding body Bilateral agreements

- MS <u>shall</u> ensure fair and <u>non-discriminatory</u> conditions (non refiners / refiners) (article 3.2).
- MS may decide to have (or not) recourse to a stockholding body or entity (article 3.3).
- Stocks <u>may</u> be held in one or more other MS if there is an intergovernmental agreement (Art. 6.2 NB: Council Decision 68/416/EEC).





Statistical summaries

- MS must submit in due course monthly statistical summaries (article 4) + information on "cross-border" holdings (article 6.2)
- MS must use the <u>consumption data of the previous year</u> (as from the 31 March) (article 4)
- If MS want to take <u>crude oil and intermediate products</u> into account they must use one of the three methods stipulated under article 5







Prospection, exploration and production directive: Directive 94/22/EC

- Objectives
- Some MS obligations





Prospection, exploration and production Legislation (Directive 94/22/EC)

Some of the main objectives of dir. 94/22:

- > A greater integration of the internal energy market (EEA relevance)
- The best prospecting, exploration and production of resources and the non-discriminatory access to and pursuit of those activities (MORE EFFICIENCY)
- To set up common rules to ensure that authorizations will be granted on the basis of objective and published criteria, as well as under conditions known in advance (MORE TRANSPARENCY)
- ➤ NB : Rights on resources: Member States retain the right to determine the areas within their territory to be made available for the exercise of the activities in question (article 2)





Prospection, exploration and production Legislation (Directive 94/22/EC)

Some of the key MS obligations towards EC:

- Notify the Commission of the competent authorities
- Decide which areas, if any, will be available under article 3.3 and communicate a notice (OJ)
- Publish the criteria for granting authorizations (OJ) and to make the conditions and requirements concerning the exercise or termination of activities available
- Publish a notice inviting applications (OJ) whenever the competitive procedure under article 3.2 is started (either at the initiative of the competent authorities or following submission of an application by an entity)





Registration for imports and deliveries

Council Regulation N° 2964/95 introducing registration for crude oil imports and deliveries in the Community





REGISTRATION FOR CRUDE OIL IMPORTS AND DELIVERIES IN THE COMMUNITY (Council Regulation 1995/2964/EC)

Main Objective

To improve **transparency** in the oil market and to monitor the evolution of crude oil imports in order to enhance the security of supply.

Allows to keep a **reliable record** of

- the origin of imported crude
- the quality of imported crude
- > the prices of imported crude



REGISTRATION FOR CRUDE OIL IMPORTS AND DELIVERIES IN THE COMMUNITY (Council Regulation 1995/2964/EC)

Data input – Member State Obligation

- Crude oil imports and deliveries data is reported on a monthly basis by concerned MS' administrations (19 out of 25) with indication of:
 - The quantity in barrels
 - The crude oil names and their API gravity
 - The percentage sulphur content of each crude
 - The average CIF price paid in US Dollars
 - The number of companies reporting
- All data is received **by e-mail** from the 19 EU MS' administrations concerned using the same 'Excel' presentation / pro-format. Data is processed by DG TREN.





REGISTRATION FOR CRUDE OIL IMPORTS AND DELIVERIES IN THE COMMUNITY (Council Regulation 1995/2964/EC)

Data output - Commission publication

- Summary reports by MS and at EU level on a cumulative monthly basis windication of the origin, the crude quality, the quantity in barrels imported and the CIF price paid in US Dollars
- Distinction made in the summary annual reports, at EU level, between Imports from EXTRA-EU and Imports from INTRA + EXTRA-EU. Percentage of dependency calculated by country of origin and by geographical zone
- Monthly and yearly data at EU level* is published on the DG TRE internet oil site: http://europa.eu.int/comm/energy/oil/
 - * MS data is not published to avoid disclosing sensitive information individual private companies

Information / consultation on costs and prices

Council Decision 1999/280/EC regarding a Community procedure for information and consultation on crude oil supply costs and the consumer prices of petroleum products.

Commission Decision of 26 July 1999.





SUPPLY COST AND CONSUMPTION PRICES (OIL BULLETIN) (Council Decision 1999/280/EC implemented by Commission Decision 1999/566/EC)

Main Objectives

- To improve the transparency of prices in the European oil market, particularly in the downstream sector
- To encourage the strengthening of the internal market in oil by providing information about supply costs and price/taxation trends across EU countries
- To increase transparency of the costs of the energy bill



SUPPLY COST AND CONSUMPTION PRICES (OIL BULLETIN) (Council Decision 1999/280/EC implemented by Commission Decision 1999/566/EC)

Data input – Member State Obligation

EU Member States submit data for the following:

- Crude Oil Supply cost monthly report: Monthly data on total CIF cost of crude imports and production (in quantity and in value US \$) within 1 month
- Monthly Oil Bulletin: Prices for the main oil products at the 15th of each month (prices with and without excises duties and taxes) within 1 month
- Weekly Oil Bulletin: Prices of each Monday for the main oil products (prices with and without excise duties and taxes) within 1 day





SUPPLY COST AND CONSUMPTION PRICES (OIL BULLETIN) (Council Decision 1999/280/EC implemented by Commission Decision 1999/566/EC)

Data output - Commission publications

- Crude Oil Supply Cost Monthly Report: Aggregated data at EU level on a cumulative monthly basis of <u>crude supply cost</u> with indication of quantities and in \$ & €.
- Monthly Oil Bulletin: Consumer prices and price without taxes of the main oil products in all EU MS (EURO and national currencies)
- Weekly Oil Bulletin: Published every Thursday/Friday with the previous Monday's consumer prices (with and without taxes) of the main oil products in all EU MS (in € and in their national currencies)
- Monthly report on the evolution of the taxation for each of the main oil products in the 25 EU MS (distinction between VAT and excise duties in € and in national currencies)
- All data is received by e-mail and processed by DG TREN
