#### **Overview**

- Household Budget Survey (HBS) was the reference data source for income distribution and social exclusion indicators until 2005
  - Harmonized HBS since 2002 regularly, with small sample size
  - Urban and rural estimation level with annual data
  - NUTS 2 estimation level with 3-year combined data
- Preparatory studies on SILC were started in 2003
- Pre-test studies were launched in 2003 and 2004





### Overview (cont'd)

- A pilot survey was implemented in 2005
- The first wave of SILC was conducted from April to June 2006 with 12 872 households





### Methodology

- The methodology of the SILC is in line with EUROSTAT studies
- All private households and their members, except institutional population, are covered
- The longitudinal dimension consist of a rotating four-year panel

#### **Estimation level**

- urban, rural and NUTS I (12 regions) for the reporting domain of the cross-sectional estimate
- urban and rural for the reporting domain of the longitudinal estimate





### Methodology (cont'd)

#### **Variables**

- All target primary variables in the Comission Regulation (EC) No 1983/2003 were included
- All variables which will have to be delivered from 2007 according to EU-SILC regulation were also included in the questionnaire

#### **Periodicity**

The cross-sectional and longitudinal data will be produced annually





### Methodology (cont'd)

**Sampling Design** 

Sampling Method: Stratified two-stage cluster sampling

Final Stage Sampling Unit: Private households

Sample Size: 12.872 households

#### **Classifications**

- NACE Rev.1.1
- ISCO-88
- ISCED-97





### Methodology (cont'd)

#### **Data Collection**

- Face to face interview with portable computer (CAPI)
- Data collection period is between April and June

#### **Reference Periods**

- Income reference period: Previous calendar year
- Labour status: Previous week, previous 4 weeks, current, working life
- Demographic characteristics of individual, social exclusion, housing, health etc.: Current, last twelve months
- Child care reference period: A typical week from January to June





#### **Future Plans**

- Studies on imputation techniques are underway for missing data and imputed rent
- 2006 SILC cross-sectional individual and household micro data will be transmitted to EUROSTAT at the end of 2007
