Council Decision 2003/725/JHA of 2 October 2003 amending the provisions of Article 40(1) and (7) of the Convention implementing the Schengen Agreement of 14 June 1985 on the gradual abolition of checks at common borders

<u>Objective:</u> Broadening the scope of the provisions concerning cross-border surveillance with a view to increasing the success of criminal investigations, particularly those concerning offences connected with organised crime.

Content:

- Article 1(1): Includes non-suspects that can assist in identifying or tracing the suspect into the scope of cross-border surveillance under Article 40(1) of the Schengen Convention.
- Article 1(2): Broadens the list of crimes allowing for cross-border surveillance under Article 40(7) of the Schengen Convention.

<u>Interesting to know:</u> The scope of non-urgent cross-border surveillance –Article 40(1)- and urgent cross-border surveillance –Article 40(2)- is currently different both regarding the possibility of surveillance of non-suspects and the lists of crimes.
