### **OVERVIEW**

- Establishing an inventory of all individual facilities to which the IPPC Directive applies
  - Technical studies have been carried out to identify the relevant installations and to establish an inventory system. Yet, further studies are on the way.
- Establishing quality control of the data received from the industrial facilities
  - Article 41(f) of the By-law on Industrial Air Pollution Control includes the principles and rules for, mounting, maintenance and calibration of measurement equipment, standards and methods to be used and accreditation requirements.
  - In addition, technical studies are carried out for establishing a data quality system.

### CORRESPONDING PROVISIONS OF NATIONAL LEGISLATION (CONT'D)

**Reporting of emissions from licensed installations** 

- Article 15 of the By-law on IAPC requires reporting of periodical monitoring of emissions (every 2 or 3 years) to the competent authority, regardless from the mass flowrates of the pollutants.
- Article 28 of the By-law on HWC (License is valid for 3 years. It can be extended if needed or given conditionally).
- According to Article 11 of the By-law on CPDSWE, discharge of dangerous substances is reported with the reconsideration of permit every 4 years.
- Article 37 of the By-law on WPC, wastewater discharge permit expires in 5 years, and renewal requires a wastewater discharge report.
- According to Article 42 of the By-law on WPC, renewal of deep sea discharge permit requires reporting of the discharges (every 5 years).





### **STUDIES AND PROGRESS**

- A project was carried out to establish a data base and reporting system with financial assistance of EU (Institutional Building and Access to Environmental Information)
- Studies for increasing institutional capacity are in progress



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### **CHALLENGES**

- Preparation of an inventory of installations
- Establishing an effective monitoring and reporting system
